Intermediate Scaffolding Course Outline



Course Aim

This unit specifies the outcomes required to erect, alter and dismantle scaffolding at the Intermediate level which includes use and operation of Cantilevered crane-loading platforms, Cantilevered and spurred scaffolds, Barrow ramps and sloping platforms, perimeter safety screens and shutters Mast climbers, and tube and coupler scaffolds (including tube and coupler covered ways and gantries) for licensing purposes.

Pre-requisites

Please note that this course has a pre-requisite requirement that participants to hold a valid Licence to perform basic scaffolding.

Course Content

The Intermediate Scaffolding course is mapped to the Nationally Recognised unit of competency:

CPCCSC3001 Licence to erect, alter and dismantle scaffolding, Intermediate, includes:

- General Safety (common scaffolding hazards and preparing a scaffolding plan)
- Types of Scaffolds (scaffolding components)
- Working Platforms (loads and load classifications)
- Foundations
- Structural Stability
- Rigidity
- Access to Scaffolds
- Modular Scaffolds
- Frame Scaffolds
- Mobile Scaffolds
- Trestle & Bracket Scaffolds
- Birdcage Scaffolds
- Ancillary Equipment (safety harnesses, record keeping and the use of gin wheels)
- Bends & Hitched
- Industrial Safety Nets
- Cantilevered Platform (Materials) Hoists
- Inspection & Maintenance of Equipment
- Certification

Successful candidates will be awarded the Nationally Recognised unit of competency **CPCCLSF3001 Licence to erect, alter and dismantle scaffolding, Intermediate Level**, recognised within the Australian Qualifications Framework (AQF). A Licence to Perform High Risk Work, class SI will also be issued upon application to Workplace Standards Tasmania

Duration: 40 hours conducted over 5 days.

Maximum Participants: 8 persons

Cost: \$1350 per person.

Reassessment

Students who do not successfully complete the course assessment or who are deemed not ready for assessment during the regular course timeframe will require an additional assessment. Additional costs will apply to any additional assessments.

Cancellations

A cancellation fee will not be charged for courses cancelled or rescheduled no less than 5 working days prior to the course start date. For courses cancelled less than 5 days prior to the start date a cancellation fee of 30% of the course cost will be charged. For courses cancelled less than 1 day prior to the start date a cancellation fee of 50% of the course cost will be charged. Full course fees will be charged for "no shows" and participants who start a course but do not complete it.
